





SUBJECT: Closing of School – Snow Days/Cold Days – Student Safety Comes First

The following is an attempt to explain the procedures used in deciding if Roseville is going to stay open or close when we are experiencing harsh weather conditions. If we are going to have an abundance of snow or very cold weather, we attempt to make a decision before 5:00 p.m. so that the information will go out on the 6:00 p.m. news. This early decision also allows parents to obtain childcare if necessary. This is not always possible especially when dealing with anticipated snow that is supposed to arrive after dark or early in the morning. A lot of factors determine if we are going to close, stay open, or in some cases, have the staff report and not the students. Some of the factors are as follows:

- The amount of snow.
- The timing of the snow.
- Is it wet or blowing snow?
- Is more snow going to arrive while we are in session?
- Temperature/Wind Chill.

We will not dismiss students and close school once the school day has started. In many cases, there is nobody at home and I am sure you understand that we do not want students leaving school and going to a non-attended house. If we are closed, there are no sporting events, no practices, and no extracurricular activities to take place. If we keep our students home for safety reasons, there is no way we can justify having them come in for practice or an activity.

Each district decides on their own if they are going to stay open or if they are going to close. Many of our students walk to school and the general rule for Roseville is that if the wind chill is -15 or below, we are going to cancel school. We also need to consider the condition of the sidewalks and roads, which can be icy if there is wet, deep snow.

Buses are another issue to think about. A district in the north end of our county may close while a district at the South end may stay open or vice versa. Roseville has over 20 buses. Many districts, especially the larger ones at the north end, have many more than we have. If the roads in the north end are extremely icy and the buses have to drive down dirt roads, this creates a very dangerous situation for the buses. The cold temperature also makes it difficult for the district buses to start.

We also have to consider attendance. If a large number of staff are absent, we have to find subs, which is becoming more difficult. If we stay open and the students do not report, we have a minimum attendance requirement for that day to count. The district student attendance must be 75% to fully count as a school day.

The current *State Aide Act* states that school districts can close for up to six (6) days without having to make up the time. In the past, we have had to close for more than the allowed six (6) days and have had to add days at the end of the school year.

Weather Guidelines for Roseville Community Schools:

1. When the actual temperature and wind-chill factor are below 10 degrees, students remain indoors.
2. Students are to be admitted to the building 10 minutes before the start of school.

Parents, please be aware that with the winter season approaching, children should attend school dressed warmly and ready for outdoor weather.

Recess is an important part of the day and students will still go outside during the winter months if the temperature and wind-chill factor are not below 10 degrees. Thank you!

When is sick too sick for school?

A regular attendance routine is important for your child's well-being and learning. These tips can help you decide when to keep your child home when they don't feel well.



SEND ME TO SCHOOL IF...

- I have a **runny nose** or just a **little cough**, but no other symptoms.
- I have **NOT had a fever overnight** and **have NOT taken fever reducing medicine** during that time.
- I have a **mild stomach ache**.
- I have **not thrown up** overnight and can drink liquids without throwing up.
- I have a **mild rash** and no other symptoms.
- I have **eye drainage WITHOUT fever**, eye pain or eyelid redness.



KEEP ME AT HOME IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4**
- I have **thrown up two or more times** in the past 24 hours.
- My **stool is watery** and I may not make it to the bathroom in time.



SEEK MEDICAL CARE IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4 AND any of the following:** ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache, headache or tooth pain.
- I have **stomach pain and fever**, I have **bloody or black stool**, or I am **dehydrated** (tired and sleepy, dry mouth) and/or I have **not urinated** in the last 8 hours.
- I have a **persistent cough or trouble breathing**, or have a fever with the cough.
- I have **eye swelling, eye pain** or an **eye injury**.
- I have a **rash that has blisters**, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises, and/or I have a fever with the rash.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried your child will spread illness, contact your child's health care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department/school district health guidance including about contagious illnesses such as Covid-19 and the flu.


